**RULES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT**  
**STREAMWOOD PARK DISTRICT**

The Board of Commissioners welcomes public comments during all meetings. The Board has adopted and approved the following rules for public comment.

1. All speakers may submit public comments via email to the designated park official from the time the agenda is made public up to 15 minutes prior to the scheduled meeting. The email must include the speaker's name and address. Public comments will be read aloud by a member of the Park Board or the Executive Director during the scheduled meeting. Emails should be sent to [jjanda@spdcares.com](mailto:jjanda@spdcares.com).
2. Each person (or representative) is limited to one (1) email submission for public comment, which comment shall not exceed 250 words.
3. All comments from the public will be limited to **three (3) minutes per person**. The President or presiding officer reserves the right to suspend or limit the length of time available for all public comments to no greater than thirty (30) minutes.
4. All comments must be civil in nature. Email comments will be rejected if the content is slanderous or threatening.
5. All other rules for public comments which have previously been adopted, and which are not in conflict with these rules, are still enforced.
6. content is slanderous or threatening.
7. All other rules for public comments which have previously been adopted, and which are not in conflict with these temporary rules, are still enforced.
